In the begining, Subject Teachers of Agomani H.S. School took classes

in the College. Among them many are not alive today. The contribution of the Subject Teachers remain today unforgettable.

The College is founded in aid of the College sorounding localities of all sections. Mr. Harendra Nath Paul (a reputed land holders and businessman) donated 20 bighas of land to found the College. From all sections, even common people also aided to the College fund. Monthly donation has been given by- Agomani S.S.Ltd, Satrasal S.S. Ltd., Proma Cinema Hall, Kaldoba, Chagolia Get, Kaldoba Market and many official persons working in several offices of Agomani. Moreover daily collection was given by the Dhubri-Coochbehar, Dhubri-Boxirhat buses and local businessmen.

In the begining only 7 (Seven) Students were admited in the College. Now the College bears more then thousand enrolment every year.

The College is of one stream (Arts). Assam Govt. alloted Science Stream in the year 2020, released fund for lobaratory arrangement. The College will start the stream after geting Govt. order.

The College got final Govt. Concurence in 1998. In 2013 the College has been provincialised by the Govt. of Assam. The Collegeoffers course under Gauhati University (Assam).

In the end the College regards its gratitude to the intelectual directors, workers, doners and guides who took steps first to found the College. The College also express its hearty wishes to the 7 (Seven) first admitted students in the College.

From the Principal's Desk.....



I extend my warm welcome to the new students to Progati College, Agomani. Established in the year 1991, the institution of higher education in this International Border Area, has turned thirty three years of its noble existence. After the establishment of the College in this educationally backward area, the dream of many poor and financially unable students of the locality, of taking not only B.A. degree from this College, but also M.A. in English, Education, Political Science, Economics and Sociology from Kishna Kanta Handique State Open University available in the College, has come to materialize.

During my tenure as a Principal, I have been concentrating to develop the educational environment as well as its academic infrastructure through creative discussion with the Governing Body, academic faculty of the College and the well wishers of the locality. Some progress to be worth-mentioned here in the college are : a spacious Auditorium Hall equipped with sound system, a modern ICT room, a spacious library facilitated with sufficient books providing reading rooms for students and teachers, as well-completed one-storeyed building worth Rs. 1 crore sanctioned by the Govt of Assam, computer education with DCA course and digital Computer Class room, a study Centre of Kishna Kanta Handique State Open University for doing Graduation and post Graduation, formation of NSS for an extra dimension to the higher education system to orient the young students to community service while they are studying in educational institutions, formation of different Cell entrusted with the responsibility of planning and monitoring the academic standard of the college as well as its infrastructural development, a hygienic Canteen in the college campus, well-planted gardens for the beautification of the campus.

Moreover, the Government had already sanctioned Rs. 10,00,000/- for science laboratory for opening Degree Science Stream which have to design academic plan in consultation with the member college to promote multi-disciplinary education. So, the students must be able to take the subject of their own choice to make career in which they passion. For the intellectual development and enhancement of writing skill among the teachers and taught, the college has been continuously publishing its Magazine "Progya", wall Magazine "Jagaran" and Research Book: "Progati" from time to time.

To create awareness of education and to develop a competitive environment among the taughts by adding an extra dimension to an educational institution- is really a hard but to crack- especially as a Head of it. So, I would not say that I have succeeded as a Principal. COURSES OFFERED :-

The College is functioning in day shift and the Four- years Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University is as per UGC's curricular frame work is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS). The FYUGP is based on the system of National Education Policy 2020.

Salient features :

- * Under the NEP's FYUGP it is a 4 year degree programme.
- * In the FYUGP, One has choice to exit from the programme thrice-after one year; after two years and after three years. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exit after three years One gets a Bachelor's Degree. Finally if a student Completes Degree (Honours).
- * In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor's Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 years.

Progression :




Fig. 1.1 : Progression under GU-FYUGP.

*** First Year (Semester I & II) :**

In the first year, one studies two different core subjects - one paper of each subjects per semester. Besides, one needs to study a host of common subjects that we have designed as per UGC's Curricular Framework. Details of these courses are described in this booklet. (i) Degree with Major & Minor; (ii) Degree with only Minor.

*** Second Year (Semester III & IV) :**

***Semester III**

*In the third semester, one will usually continue with the same core subjects that have already been chosen in the first year and again study some common subjects. In the third semester, one will also take a step forward to study the favourite subject by **declaring** one of the core subjects as a **Major** subject and another as **Minors** or two Minors only.*

*** Semester IV**

From Semester IV onwards, one will primarily study the (i) Major subject by taking at least four papers and one paper on Minor subject. Some of which may be elective depending on the subject concerned (ii) Two Minor subjects by taking at least five papers.

As the programme structure in the third semester is same as the first & second semester, one will have the option of changing the Major in fourth semester to any one of the other one Minor as well, even if one has already declared a Major in the third semester. However this has the condition that the new Major subject of choice has vacancy.

*** Third Year**

In the third year, one will continue to study (i) the Major subject to complete a full set of 15 papers in Majors along with one paper on Minor subject in semester V & VI or (ii) to study the Minor subjects to complete a full set of 21 papers.

* **Fourth Year**

If one intends to progress to the fourth year, s/he will be devoting the time in studying advanced courses which will be at the level of initial Master/s degree papers. Besides, one will also have the opportunity of engaging into research work with the faculty members.

Besides the above, there are some more unique features of the FYUGP.

Double Major :

If a student is ready to do some more hard work s/he can take some extra online courses (from designated courses only) related to the Minors and can then convert one of the minors to a second Major by the time one completes 3/4 years of study. This is over and above the first Major. In this case, one will have a Bachelor's Degree with Double Major.

Course Structure :

FYUGP is divided into two parts :-

- i) Core courses and*
- ii) Common courses.*

The minimum credit allocation for a 3 years programme is 84 credits in core courses and 36 credits in common courses. Which comes to total of minimum of 120 credits for a 3 years programme with the Fourth year, the minimum credits becomes 160.

Core Courses :

The core courses determine the ultimate degree, diploma, or certificate a student will earn at the end of third (or fourth) year; second year or first year respectively. The performance in the core courses will determine the grade of the student in the final examinations. A student will need to study at least two core subjects.

Major and Minors :

In case of a Bachelor's Degree in Arts, a student either chooses a Major and Minor or just Minors from among the subjects. In any case a student needs to complete 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year. A Major course must carry a minimum credit of 60 and a Minor course should carry a minimum credit of 24. Usually, for majority of the students the core course will consist of one Major and two on Minors.

Common Courses :

The common courses are to be studied by all students alike all-together they carry a total credits of 36 over a 3 year period. These courses are further divided into five (5) sub-categories, as described below.

1. Multi-disciplinary courses : (3 credit each)

All students need to three Multidisciplinary courses during semester I, II & III.

2. Value Added Course : (2 credit each)

All students need to take one (VAC) from any of the following during semester I, II & III

Studies in language in India.

Ability Enhancement (2 Credit each)

All students need to take four Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) from two groups -

1) MIL (Modern Indian Language and Alternative English) during Semester -I

2) Communicative Englsh during Semister-II.

Skill Enhancement Course :- (3 Credit each)

All students need to take three skill Enhancement course (SEC) from a pool of courses during 1,2 & 3 (Semester)

All student are to carry out an internship with a credit allocation of 4. The Internship can be carried out during Semester-V. An internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.


